Discussion Point

Statistics for Q4

- The Statistics gathered for Q4 were distributed prior to the meeting and presented here.
- The Co-ordinator asked that data is submitted on time to facilitate her diary and ensure inclusion in the statistics. 50% of group had submitted on time
- Data submitted by projects had been collated and sent to members with prep- a discussion took place as
 the type of data that can be extracted- including highlighting that trends though anecdotal may not always
 have evidence to prove them. It was agreed that although qualitative data plays an important role, there is
 a clear need for quantitative data to provide some substantive evidence if the T&R group or the CCLDATF
 are to advocate local needs on a national scale or for funding purposes.
- Only one project is currently submitting to the NDTRS which also limits the ability to take part in national dialogue.
- No Gaps and Blocks had been submitted this quarter- and most in Q3 were on a national scale, discussion
 that although group should feed into the national picture- it would not be beneficial to focus solely on gaps
 unattainable to CCLDATF or this T&R group
- The use of eCass system is varied across all the projects, it was suggested that projects could link with each other to offer tips, a proposal has been submitted by the Co-ordinator to the CCLDATF for training and implementation, and that EncludeIT also provide supports to individual projects as part of their contract.
